A. What are some _____ examples of prayers of _____?

1. By _____

*Genesis 20:17-18 **Then Abraham prayed to God, and God healed Abimelek, his wife and his female slaves so they could have children again, ¹⁸ for the Lord had kept all the women in Abimelek's household from conceiving because of Abraham's wife Sarah. NIV***

*Genesis 21:1-5 Now the Lord was gracious to Sarah as he had said, and the Lord did for Sarah what he had promised. ² Sarah became pregnant and bore a son to Abraham in his old age, at the very time God had promised him. ³ **Abraham gave the name Isaac to the son Sarah bore him.** ⁴ When his son Isaac was eight days old, Abraham circumcised him, as God commanded him. ⁵ **Abraham was a hundred years old when his son Isaac was born to him. NIV***

*Genesis 22:15-18 **The angel of the Lord called to Abraham from heaven a second time ¹⁶ and said, "I swear by myself, declares the Lord, that because you have done this and have not withheld your son, your only son, ¹⁷ I will surely bless you and make your descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as the sand on the seashore. Your descendants will take possession of the cities of their enemies, ¹⁸ and through your offspring all nations on earth will be blessed, because you have obeyed me."** NIV*

2. By Abraham's _____

*Genesis 23:1-2 **Sarah lived to be a hundred and twenty-seven years old. ² She died at Kiriath Arba (that is, Hebron) in the land of Canaan, and Abraham went to mourn for Sarah and to weep over her. NIV***

*Genesis 24:1-7, 12-16, ⁶⁷ **Abraham was now very old, and the Lord had blessed him in every way. ² He said to the senior servant in his household, the one in charge of all that he had, "Put your hand under my thigh. ³ I want you to swear by the Lord, the God of heaven and the God of earth, that you will not get a wife for my son from the daughters of the Canaanites, among whom I am living, ⁴ but will go to my country and my own relatives and get a wife for my son Isaac."** ⁵ The servant asked him, "What if the woman is unwilling to come back with me to this land? Shall I then take your son back to the country you came from?" ⁶ "Make sure that you do not take my son back there," Abraham said. ⁷ "The Lord, the God of heaven, who brought me out of my father's household and my native land and who spoke to me and promised me on oath, saying, 'To your offspring I will give this land'—**he will send his angel before you so that you can get a wife for my son from there. ¹² Then he prayed, "Lord, God of my master Abraham, make me successful today, and show kindness to my master Abraham. ¹³ See, I am standing beside this spring, and the daughters of the townspeople are coming out to draw water. ¹⁴ May it be that when I say to a young woman, 'Please let down your jar that I may have a drink,' and she says, 'Drink, and I'll water your camels too'—let her be the one you have chosen for your servant Isaac. By this I will know that you have shown***

kindness to my master.” ¹⁵ **Before he had finished praying, Rebekah came out with her jar on her shoulder. She was the daughter of Bethuel son of Milkah, who was the wife of Abraham’s brother Nahor.** ¹⁶ The woman was very beautiful, a virgin; no man had ever slept with her. She went down to the spring, filled her jar and came up again. ⁶⁷ Isaac brought her into the tent of his mother Sarah, **and he married Rebekah. So she became his wife, and he loved her;** and Isaac was comforted after his mother’s death. NIV

3. By Abraham’s _____

Genesis 25:19-21 This is the account of the family line of Abraham’s son Isaac. Abraham became the father of Isaac, ²⁰ and **Isaac was forty years old when he married Rebekah** daughter of Bethuel the Aramean from Paddan Aram and sister of Laban the Aramean. ²¹ **Isaac prayed to the Lord on behalf of his wife,** because she was childless. **The Lord answered his prayer, and his wife Rebekah became pregnant.** NIV

Genesis 25:21 **Isaac prayed hard to God for his wife** because she was barren. God answered his prayer and Rebekah became pregnant. MSG

4. By Abraham’s _____

Genesis 25:22-28 The babies jostled each other within her, **and she said, “Why is this happening to me?” So she went to inquire of the Lord.** ²³ The Lord said to her, **“Two nations are in your womb, and two peoples from within you will be separated; one people will be stronger than the other, and the older will serve the younger.”** ²⁴ When the time came for her to give birth, **there were twin boys in her womb.** ²⁵ The first to come out was red, and his whole body was like a hairy garment; so they named him Esau. ²⁶ After this, his brother came out, with his hand grasping Esau’s heel; so he was named Jacob. **Isaac was sixty years old when Rebekah gave birth to them.** ²⁷ The boys grew up, and Esau became a skillful hunter, a man of the open country, while Jacob was content to stay at home among the tents. ²⁸ **Isaac, who had a taste for wild game, loved Esau, but Rebekah loved Jacob.** NIV

5. By Abraham’s _____

Galatians 3:6-9 So also **Abraham “believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness.”** ⁷ Understand, then, that **those who have faith are children of Abraham.** ⁸ Scripture foresaw that **God would justify the Gentiles by faith,** and announced the gospel in advance to Abraham: **“All nations will be blessed through you.”** ⁹ **So those who rely on faith are blessed along with Abraham, the man of faith.** NIV

Romans 10:9-15 **If you declare with your mouth, “Jesus is Lord,” and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.** ¹⁰ For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved. ¹¹ As Scripture says, **“Anyone who believes in him will never be put to shame.”** ¹² For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile—the same Lord is Lord of all and richly **blesses all who call on him,** ¹³ for, **“Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”** ¹⁴ **How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?** ¹⁵ **And how can anyone preach unless they are sent?** As it is written: **“How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!”** NIV
